

...for those who honor Me I will honor, and those who despise Me shall be lightly esteemed.

July 4 in the United States marks the day the United States officially became a nation. On this day, we honor the founding fathers for their bravery and foresight in declaring this nation free from British rule. There are other days set aside to honor veterans, memorial day, Mother's day, Father's day and many others.

While I welcome the opportunity to celebrate and have a special cookout, or fireworks, or whatever marks an occasion, it is also sad that many people have no idea of how to honor someone or something. What about honor?

The scripture above is taken from a time when the Lord (through the prophet Samuel) was correcting Eli, a priest who was over worship in the house of the Lord. Eli's sons who were also priests, were wicked men – stealing offerings, treating the people badly, and having physical relations with women who came to the temple. Eli knew this was going on and he just let it keep going. The Lord told Eli in the previous verse (29) that Eli was honoring his sons more than he was honoring God.

The point here is that we *should* love each other and love our friends and family, but we should love God *more*. And we must not let things go on in our family, our houses, our workplaces that are dishonoring to God.

If something's not in your control, that's a different matter. But if it's something you have some authority over, and you let it go and you know it's ungodly and against God, you're honoring them more than you are God. That should not be.

Notice it doesn't say He will despise (hate) you. God is love, and He loves us no matter what we do – but if we live outside the protection of His kingdom, He will not lift you up and honor you when you're going the wrong way. That would be the same as saying that what you are doing is just fine with Him.

This generation is suffering from the rebellion that was sown in the 60's. We are living in a generation of people who threw away respect and honor. Nothing is holy, everything is common, no terms of respect or reverence – we're all equal, no rules - if it feels good, do it. So a lot of people in this generation just don't know honor. And they have no clue of how disrespectful they are because they were never taught honor. And if you didn't grow up with it, you're just not aware. How can you miss what you never had?

As we visit different churches, I am surprised by how disrespectful people are. And it's not my place to say anything or try to correct, but I know they are paying a price for it. There is a cost in the anointing. There is a cost in revelation, in the move of the Spirit. Without honor nothing's really important – how we look, how we act... no big deal.

But I believe that in God, there are things that **are** big deals. But for things to happen it has to be important to somebody. It has to be a big deal to somebody. And it's not just making a big deal out of church, or out of people, out of the order of service... it's making a big deal out of God. There is no bigger deal!

There are so many facets of honor that I don't have space to addresss here, but here is something to think about: The Bible tells us to honor the Lord in word and in deed - not just talk, it's about what's in our hearts. Proverbs 3:9-10 says: Honor the Lord with your possessions (substance), And with the firstfruits of all your increase; So your barns will be filled with plenty, And your vats will overflow with new wine.

It wouldn't be honorable for Marta and I to put a dollar in the offering. God has blessed us more than that. We need to do something in proportion to how God has blessed us. Something that's honorable. And it's not all about money. It can be an act that shows you're thankful and you value what He's done for you. But sometimes people bring junk and broken stuff, "...good enough for who it's for."

People don't realize how things like that are costing them.

Because if you fail to respect and honor His things, how are your things going to be treated? Unimportant! But if you treat His things as valuable and important, He will treat you and your things as valuable and important.

I believe we all need to learn more about honor because this is tied directly to what God is able to do in our lives because who is He able to honor? Those who honor Him! Do you have a desire to be used more, have more of an impact on people's lives, increase, do more, reach further? It would be His grace, and as He graces us to do those things, that's honoring us. And for that to happen, we honor Him. ...*those who honor Me I will honor*.

Any gift you may like to give towards any of thes things will be greatly appreaciated.
