I am the Lord, I have called you in righteousness, I will also hold you by the hand and watch over you, and I will appoint you as a covenant to the people, as a light to the nations... Isaiah 42:6

2 Corinthians 4:18

...while we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen are temporary, but the things which are not seen are eternal.

How do you look at things that you can't see? This is obviously not talking about a natural way of looking at something. So, we can see there is a natural seeing, or natural vision, and there is also a spiritual seeing – spiritual vision.

The Apostle Paul is writing here to Christians. And as Christians we have the ability to look at things which are not seen. Those things that are seen are temporary – that's why we are not to give so much attention to them. Everything that our 5 senses can pick up, things you can see, hear, smell, taste or touch - are all very temporary. You can step outside and you can tell if it's cold or hot, but that can change – especially at this time of year. So he's saying we shouldn't give too much notice to those things, because they will change. You don't try to build our life on those things. But it is important how we see things.

Most of us know how faith comes - Romans 10:17 – faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. But I don't think too many people really understand what is happening when we hear something. We see what we hear. If you don't see it, you don't have full understanding of it.

We deal with people, and treat people and things totally based on how we see them. If you change the way you see a thing, you will also change the way you treat it.

The Apostle Paul had a big change in the way He saw things on the road to Damascus. Paul (Saul at that time) saw followers of Jesus as something that should be eliminated from the face of the earth. In Acts chapter 9 Paul was on his way to Damascus for the very purpose of cleansing the area of followers of this new sect when Jesus Himself confronted him and began to put in him a different way of seeing things - a different vision.

known world - to gentiles, kings and the children of Israel. Paul had a vision of standing before kings and he did! He stood before Festus, Felix and Caesar. He did it!

And it wasn't just a simple thing. For instance, he was out in the middle of the sea in a huge storm (Acts 27) and it looked like he wasn't going to make it, when an angel came and stood by him and told him the whole crew would be saved because of him. It was as if the angel reminded him, "Paul, you can't die out here, because you've got to see Caesar." The vision of victory in Paul was much greater than the attack of the enemy.

Then there's Father Abraham. Talk about an impossible vision! But here is the key to his victory in **Rom 4:19-21**:

19 And not being weak in faith, he did not consider his own body, already dead (since he was about a hundred years old), and the deadness of Sarah's womb.

20 He did not waver at the promise of God through unbelief, but was strengthened in faith, giving glory to God,

21 and being fully convinced that what He had promised He was also able to perform.

Notice that Abraham didn't deny the obvious problem of age and infertility, he just didn't consider it. He was convinced that what God had promised (vision) God was able to perform.

Another great example of the importance of how you see things is the story of the 12 spies Moses sent to spy out the promised land (Numbers 13 and 14). All 12 spies "saw" the same things, but ten returned with what the Bible calls an "evil" report. While they saw themselves as grasshoppers, unable to take the land, Joshua and Caleb saw the promised land through the eyes of the vision God gave them to possess the land. Of that whole generation, only Joshua and Caleb lived to enter the land and enjoy the victory God had promised. The others had a vision of going back to Egypt, or dying in the wilderness, and that's what they got!

We are talking about a *spiritual* vision that is essential to **Paul received a** new vision of taking the gospel to all the victory. How do you see yourself? If you can begin to see
